All authors in the paper should give meaningful **affiliations** and **ORCID** provided in the paper.

At least one of authors should have PhD / Dr. Sc. in Computer Science and more than 4 papers indexed in DBLP (<https://dblp.org/>).

The paper should have **not more than 4 authors**.

One person should submit **not more than 2 papers**.

Deadlines:

Submission of online form with a paper, and author agreement

– **24.03.2025**

Paper acceptance – **14.04.2025**

Camera-ready paper – **21.04.2025**

Workshop – **05.05.2025**

Paper submission:

For each paper the submitting author should print, fill, manually sign, and scan as a jpg file the Author Agreement.

Paper Selection Policy

For CMIS we accept only **regular papers** having at least **10 standard pages** and an appropriate number of references.

We do not accept **pre-published papers** (presented at or published at or submitted to any other workshop/conference/journal/book).

The papers should not contain **misconduct** (including plagiarism, self-plagiarism, fabrication, falsification i.e.)

We accept only **papers** that fulfill the **CMIS topics in the area of Computer Science, Information Systems, and Information Technology**.

The paper's **scientific novelty** (impact to the theory of Computer Science) should be **significant**. We may reject papers without new significant results for Computer Science.

The papers should follow and satisfy to the **CEUR-WS Policy on AI-Assisting Tools**: <https://ceur-ws.org/GenAI/Policy.html>

Submission of papers to the CMIS is **open** to all authors from all over the world regardless of their age, sex, nationality, religion, project membership.

Each paper submitted to CMIS will be **checked for plagiarism, and peer reviewed by at least two reviewers** with Ph.D / Dr. Sc. in Computer Science and **one PC member**. In the **final decision** will be made by the CMIS PC Chair.

Ethical Issues

We recommend authors, reviewers, and editors to follow the Elsevier **Publishing Ethics**: <https://www.elsevier.com/about/policies/publishing-ethics> and **COPE statements** <https://publicationethics.org/cope-position-statements>

The **papers** and volumes published on CEUR-WS.org are **freely accessible for academic and private use**.

We strongly discourage **re-publication** of papers that are already published at CMIS. Making a copy of the paper available on the author's home page or on the institutional repository is not regarded as a re-publication. In such cases, authors should include a reference/URL to the original publication. We advise authors to be careful about publishing versions of their paper that deviate from the originally published version because it could diminish the authenticity of the paper.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Is paper publishing and participation are free of charge? Yes.

How much own papers of authors allowed to be cited in the references? We recommend to provide not more than 20-25% of references in the paper as references to own works of authors.

What number of references is recommended? It should be not less than 10, but we recommend to provide 15-20 references (generally to scientific sources).

Are references on Cyrillic sources acceptable? Generally we recommend to provide references only on English sources published in international publishing houses / journals / conferences with DOI or indexed in Scopus / Web of Science.

What percent of plagiarism is allowed? We do not allow plagiarism and self-plagiarism. If you use previously published materials you should provide correct references. The percentage of text borrowings (with references) should not exceed 10% of the paper text.

How to dispute a review on my paper? Due to time constraints, we are not able to dispute the final decision on the paper rejection. This decision is made by the book editor based on the received reviews. Authors can submit rejected papers to other conferences. If the paper is recommended for publication after revision, then we recommend the authors to make all the necessary changes in the paper and update it in EasyChair.
